

Watering your newly planted Trees & Shrubs

Your new trees and shrubs need to establish themselves as quickly as possible, especially during the hot summer months. Correct watering is the only way to ensure this. The following guidelines are designed to help you achieve this:-

- 1 It is recommended to use a slow release fertiliser with any new planting.
- 2 If planting is undertaken by the landscaper or designer, the plants will be well watered at the time of planting. The responsibility is then with the client to maintain the watering.
- 3 After the initial soaking, the soil around the plant must be checked every day and watering as required, making sure the soil is moist enough. Never let the soil become dry as this will result in wilting, loss of leaf and then eventually death of the plant.
- 4 Do not rely on the rain to do the job for you, certainly during the summer months as this is rarely enough to penetrate deeper than a few inches into the soil.
- 5 Always arrange for a neighbour or friend to continue the watering when you go away, even if it is only for a short time.
- 6 Automatic systems are also readily available and make life so much easier.
